

SUMMERSALT COVID-19 PROTOCOLS

// COVID - 19 PROTOCOLS //

As of April 15, 2021, the following protocols will serve as our guiding principles for Summer 2021. However, as the time for camp approaches, SCBC staff will monitor CDC Guidelines and update the protocols at the beginning of each month to maintain a high level of participant and staff safety as much as possible.

// GENERAL COVID - 19 GUIDING PRINCIPLES //

With the very core goals of our camps being achieved in the context of a relational environment, it is imperative that we provide our programming in the "Lowest Risk" Category as much as possible. This will in part be addressed by:

- Assuring that our Bible Study Groups have students from a minimal number of different churches with the goal of students per group representing only 1-3 churches (Exception: Catalyst and Worship Leader Tracks)
- Asking our staff to assist with designating space in the chapel for each specific church group with a safe distance between each group
- Asking all staff and participants to remain 6 feet apart as much as possible
- Requiring all staff and participants to wear masks when indoors except for: in dorm rooms and while eating; masks will be optional when seated in the classroom for Bible Study and while gathered in church groups in the chapel, and when in Church Group Devotions.
- Providing the SummerSalt/KidSalt Daily Health Questionnaire for leaders to assess a daily health check for themselves and each camper in their group (Lanyard and out of room = Green Check)
- Anyone visiting SummerSalt must have prior approval from one of the camp directors and will need to use the LiveSafe app to verify their wellness for the day/evening of the visit. No overnight guests are allowed.

// COVID-19 POLICIES AND PROCEDURES //

- Camp directors (Bryant Laird for SummerSalt and Kathy Miles for KidSalt) will provide their contact information to all adult leaders and to CSU leaders involved in hosting our camps to serve as designated persons to respond to any COVID-19 concerns.
- All SCBC leaders and staff will self-monitor and use the LiveSafe app daily to assess their ability to participate in leading campers safely.
- We will ask campers/leaders to eat at a table with only campers/leaders from their church and/or Bible Study Group as much as possible during group meal times.
- Any participant (adult leader or camper) who develops symptoms of COVID-19 will be isolated from others, and arrangements will be made to have the individual picked up from camp. This guideline will include any other campers or leaders who have been within 6 feet of the symptomatic person for 15 minutes or longer and not wearing a mask. Adult leaders should report ALL incidences of symptomatic persons to the designated camp directors ASAP.

// FACILITIES AND SUPPLIES //

- We will encourage church leaders to bring paper towels for drying hands rather than communal towels in the dorm restrooms.
- We will encourage church leaders to bring disinfectant sprays to use in dorm bathrooms between usage by campers.
- SummerSalt Staff will be provided with antiseptic sprays/wipes to clean desks and frequently used surface areas in the classrooms.
- We will minimize the shared use of objects in our team building and group activity games as much as possible.
- We will provide churches/groups with a staggered schedule for meal times to provide opportunities for cleaning tables between groups.
- The pool will be used for organized games under the direction of the SCBC Camp Recreation Director. Physical distancing between campers will be maintained as much as possible.
